The club aims to improve the mental and physical health of individuals with CP and create a sense of community through football. the funding provided to CPUFC has helped the club survive through the difficult period of covid-19 and a cost of living crisis.

The increase in prices and growth in numbers of people accessing the provision meant that the club had to find money to hire more space and obtain more equipment and kit. The funding has enabled the club to sustain the sessions and grow in terms of numbers attending.
